NEW CLINIC BUILDING UPDATE



With the shell of the building largely completed last fall, much progress has been made on the interior of our new facility over the winter. Mechanicals, sheet rock, flooring, and trim carpentry are largely complete on the first and second floors. On the lower-level walkout basement, interior work is underway on the community education room, demonstration kitchen for our dietitians' programs, restrooms, and the staff locker room. Less than half of the full basement will be finished; the balance will be reserved for future needs in the years to come.

Work on the interior of the building should be completed by early summer and will leave us in good shape to complete paving, landscaping, furnish the spaces, and move in before fall. We look forward to welcoming the community to our Open House & 10th Anniversary celebration on September 9, 2023, more details to follow.

The new facility will allow us to fulfill our mission and help improve the quality of life for those with rare genetic conditions through patient care, education, and research. Having the first clinic building of our own will allow us to enhance our services to better meet the needs of a growing community.

ABOUT THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINIC

The Mission of the Community Health Clinic (CHC) is to provide excellent and affordable medical care consistent with the needs of the Amish, Mennonite and other rural northern Indiana communities with a focus on individuals and families with special health care needs. The CHC embraces, incorporates and promotes participation in research to advance medical knowledge and improve care.



The CHC was founded in a unique collaboration with the local community in 2008. Careful planning and community support allowed us to begin to see patients in 2013, offering high quality care at a greatly reduced cost to our families. We are open to the public, with a particular focus on serving the Plain communities. Currently, more than three fourths of our patients are from the Amish and Mennonite churches. Much of our annual budget comes from donations and fundraisers.

Over the last nine plus years, we have served over 5,100 patients, both children and adults, with rare genetic and metabolic disorders. Most of our patient families come from Indiana and Michigan, but we have served both Plain and non-Plain families from 15 different states and several foreign countries. Our clinic provides medical management of complex diseases and offers genetic counseling, dietary management, and newborn screening. We have very good working relationships with regional hospitals and health systems, routinely working with them to provide additional services to our patients in need. Our patient population continues to grow, both near our clinic and in outlying communities. Throughout the year, we now see patients in five outreach clinic locations, as far north as Clare, Michigan and south to Paoli, Indiana.

The CHC has made significant progress building an understanding of the community's rare disease burden. With families as partners, the clinic has been able to provide earlier diagnoses, better treatments, and improved outcomes. This has resulted in a rapidly expanding patient base and a growing understanding that there are still many families yet to be identified who would benefit from our services. The disorders that affect the Plain communities are not unique to them; what we learn through research and care of our patients benefits all. Education is a critical part of our mission for families and clinicians. We collaborate with physicians and medical researchers across the country and around the globe to share our expertise, learn from others, and help ensure a better future for all those affected by rare disorders.

After more than 8,600 patient visits, our clinic has developed expertise providing diagnoses and high-quality, affordable care for more than 250 rare conditions. Early diagnoses result in greatly improved health outcomes and significant financial savings for families and the broader community. The Community Health Clinic's commitment is firmly rooted in the region and what we learn together with patient families has truly global impact. We are grateful for the community's advocacy and support, and truly blessed to do this privileged work.


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have allowed us to achieve 93.9% of our \$4.06 million goal. Just 6.1%, \$248,103, remains to complete construction of our new clinic!

CHC's Case Management Services

Imagine that you are a parent of a child

with complex medical needs. In addition to coming to our genetics clinic, your child also sees numerous specialties such as neurology, cardiology, and ophthalmology. Your child also has developmental delays, and is in need of speech, occupational and physical therapies, as well as special equipment such as a wheelchair and a bath seat. Oh, and your child needs an Echo and a Video EEG. Overwhelming?? Managing all of these issues can be, especially if you have no idea where to start looking for what your child needs.

Helping in such a situation is the job of a case manager. A case manager can help you locate resources, apply for financial assistance, schedule tests, and coordinate appointments. Whether you live in Elkhart and LaGrange counties, geographically close to the CHC, or live in one of our outreach areas such as Michigan or southern Indiana, we can help with the legwork of finding the outside care and resources that you need.

Your child's needs may change over time too, and you may find that new issues arise. As your child reaches adulthood, he/she may need to transfer from pediatric providers to those who work with adults. As a parent, you may need to grapple with how much independence your child is capable of, and what the future will look like for your child. A case manager can help during this transition by providing information about new providers and programs for adults, and helping you understand the need for and the process of obtaining legal guardianship.

Case management is not just for children, but can be helpful to adults with healthcare needs as well. Finding specialists, scheduling appointments and tests, communicating with your workplace about your needs, and finding resources for your specific condition are just some of the issues that a case manager can assist you with.

At the CHC, we are constantly building a network of people, providers, and organizations that can provide services for you and your family. Our goal is to listen to you, work with you, and support you on this journey. If you have a question, or are looking for information, call the clinic and ask for a case manager. We might not have the answer right away, but will be happy to help you look for it!
